Creating a Pollinator-Friendly Garden

A balanced bee diet includes nectar and pollen. Planting a variety of pollinator-friendly plants gives pollinators multiple flower shapes and continuous blooms from which to choose.

- **1.** Choose **native flowers and plants** when planning your garden.
- **2.** Select plants with a variety of flower colors, shapes and sizes.
- 3. **Clustered flowers of one species** will attract more pollinators than individual plants.
- **4.** A healthy pollinator garden offers bees clean water sources scattered throughout.
